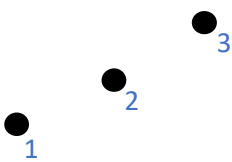

The survey runs from 17th to 24th February. Wait until at least 7pm on a clear night, wander outside and find a spot well away from streetlights / other lights and with a good view to the South. Familiarise yourself with the sky for 10 to 15 minutes to allow your eyes to become accustomed to the darkness. After this, look South to find Orion with its characteristic Belt of 3 stars. The area to count is within the bright stars Betelgeuse, Bellatrix, Rigel and Saiph and the first 3 stars in your count are shown. Count all the stars you can see in the area excluding these 4 bright corner stars.

From 17th February, you can use <https://bathastronomers.org.uk/starcount2023> to find the CPRE form and send in your results. The more stars you count, the less the light pollution in your local area, the less disturbance to local wildlife and the better the stargazing.
